Special Issue on Impact Evaluation of Public Policies - 2019

During the last decade, Spain and other European countries have designed public policies to obtain certain goals and objectives in the society and the economy at large. The need to understand whether such policies work, as well as the level and nature of impacts on intended beneficiaries, are main concerns to national and regional governments and international organizations such as EU, OECD, World Bank, IMF, etc. For this reason, the use of quantitative impact estimation methods to assess the casual effects of public interventions has expanded rapidly over the past decade in the literature.

- Transport
